Biographical Sketch

Hongsong Zhang is an Associate Professor of Economics in the HKU Business School at the University of Hong Kong (HKU), where he teaches graduate and undergraduate Microeconomics, International Trade, and Topics in Economic Research. His research covers Empirical Industrial Organization and International Trade, with a focus on productivity and firm dynamics. He is especially interested in questions broadly related to firm heterogeneity, international sourcing, quality upgrading, and how relevant domestic and international policies impact individual firms and aggregate economy. His research has been published in leading general interest and top field journals in Economics, including *International Economic Review (x2), European Economic Review*, and *Journal of Development Economics*. He has won multiple external grants from the General Research Funds of the Hong Kong Research Grants Council.

He was elected as a member of the executive committee of the China Trade Research Group (CTRG) in 2018, and appointed as an external expert researcher at the Center for International Finance and Economic Research in Tsinghua University. He frequently reviews papers for leading general interest and field journals, such as Review of Economics and Statistics, International Economic Review, Journal of International Economics, and Journal of Development Economics. Starting 2020, he also serves as an Associate Editor for IJIO (International Journal of Industrial Organization).

Before joining HKU, Dr. Zhang received his Ph.D. in Economics from the Pennsylvania State University in 2013, where he taught undergraduate "Intermediate Macroeconomics". He received his M.A. in Economics from Peking University in 2008 and B.A. in Economics from the China Youth University for Political Sciences in 2004.
